
## Bio

## Saanich Fair History

In 1868 10 peninsula farmers got together. The Fair began as a way for a small group of the pioneer farming families to have an annual gathering dedicated to celebrating their farms, gardens, and homes. They started out hosting the Fair on one of the fields owned by those 10 men.

They used to move it around from year to year, from one field to the next, and its popularity just kept growing, Western Canada's oldest Fair, the Fair is now the largest of its kind on Vancouver Island and on par with the Interior Provincial Exhibition on the Mainland and encompasses 43 acres of land on a permanent fair site that is the envy of other municipalities.

Today, the North and South Saanich Agricultural Society organizes the Fair with the mission to promote agriculture into the future. The Fair employs five full-time staff and the 11-member Board of Directors now oversees the activities of more than 2,000 volunteers. Although the 10 men who started the Fair are long gone, in many cases the farming families who were there at the beginning are still actively farming the area.
